I did receive several 'artwork' pages which I'll print some next time, but a few were too risqué – a couple even made me blush! I didn't think that was possible. Ha Ha

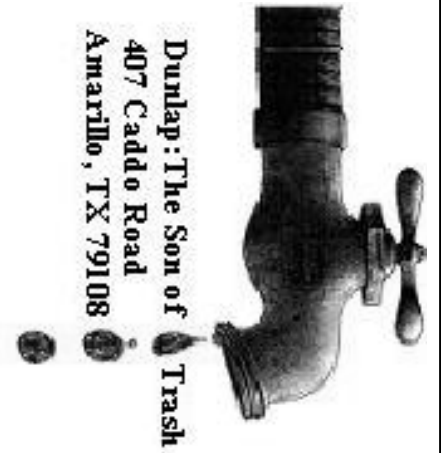
We have a few family members getting out this month, we wish them the best and encourage them to “STAY OUT” of trouble and behave themselves. Peace Out.

Today's Educational Notes

Know Your Rights, Publications Sent by Mail

Legal Test

Restrictions on prisoners' access to publications cannot be arbitrary; they must be "reasonably related to legitimate penological interests." Nonetheless, in practice, courts generally will accept the judgment of prison authorities in deciding whether censoring a publication is reasonable.

Following the Supreme Court's decision in *Turner*; courts consider the following factors in determining whether prison censorship is permissible:

1) **Whether there is a "valid, rational connection between the prison regulation and the legitimate governmental interest to justify it."** In other words, does the censorship serve a valid purpose, such as preventing violence? This factor is the most important and often determines how courts rule.

2) **Whether there are "alternative means of exercising the right that remain open to prison inmates."** For example, if prisoners cannot receive certain publications in the mail, do they have other access to publications? For example, can prisoners still receive other publications in the mail or read books in a library?

3) **What impact the "accommodation of the asserted constitutional right" will have on "guards and other inmates, and on the allocation of prison resources generally."** In other words, what are the downsides (including financial cost to the prison system) of not censoring publications?

4) **Whether there are "ready alternatives" for furthering the governmental interest.**

In other words, is there something obvious the prison could do that would protect whatever interest the prison has in mind (such as security) without banning publications?

The *Turner* standard applies to convicted prisoners, and somewhat greater protections may apply to pre-trial detainees held in jails. The law is unsettled as to the protections afford to immigration detainees. Some courts have held that immigration detainees are entitled to greater protection than pretrial detainees.

Even if a policy is facially constitutional (meaning the policy itself does not violate the Constitution) you may be able to argue that the policy as applied to the particular material you want to receive violates the Constitution.

Right of Notice

Prisoners have a right to be notified by prison officials when they censor an incoming publication.

Gift Subscriptions

Most courts have held that prison officials cannot prevent friends or family members from purchasing gift subscriptions for prisoners by forcing prisoners to pay for subscriptions out of their own accounts.

Practical Considerations

In theory, prisons and jails cannot unreasonably restrict access to publications. Nonetheless, winning a lawsuit that challenges a restriction on publications (even a seemingly unreasonable restriction) is not an easy task. Courts will expect you to be able to prove that a restriction serves no reasonable purpose. This means that even to defeat a policy that seems arbitrary or too restrictive on its face, you will probably still need to develop a full *Continued Page 15.....*

factual record about whether the policy is justified. This can be extremely difficult if you do not have the funds to conduct full discovery or afford expert witnesses.

In some cases, you may be able to show that a policy is unreasonable because the prison's rationale conflicts with other policies. For example, if a prison bars magazines on the ground that they create a fire hazard but allows newspapers and books that create similar fire risks, you may be able to show the ban on magazines is not rational.

If you are challenging the failure to deliver publications on a limited number of occasions, a court may hold that prison officials did not violate the Constitution by failing to deliver the publications to you even if you had a constitutional right to receive them. This is because isolated failures to deliver publications may be the result of negligence by mail room personnel, rather than intent to violate the Constitution.

When you learn that a publication has been rejected, you should always try to check the institution's publication policy. If you believe the policy has been violated, you may be able to get the publication delivered by filing a grievance showing that the failure to deliver the publication violated the policy.

Things Not to Buy In 2010

Ten years ago, most homes relied on dial-up connections to access the Internet and iPods, flat-screen TVs and the Nintendo Wii didn't exist. As a result, some consumer products appear poised for a dip in sales, which could be a prelude to obsolescence. Here are 10 items not to buy in 2010.

DVD's The days of going to a video shop to rent a movie are at an end. In September, Blockbuster said it plans to close roughly 22% of its stores by the end of 2010; meanwhile, third-quarter revenue was down 21% from the year-ago period. (The company didn't return calls for comment.) Looking ahead, DVD purchases could turn cold, as well. On average, DVDs sell for at least \$20 each. That's pricier than signing up for Netflix or renting movies from cable providers' on-demand channels.**Home Telephone Service** Ditching your home phone is easier now than it has been in the past, as cell phone companies compete for greater market share and alternatives to the home landline continue growing. For example, magicJack provides phone service when it's plugged into a computer's USB port and a home phone. It costs \$39.95 and includes a one-year license for calls in the U.S. and Canada; after that, service costs \$19.95 per year. **Digital Cameras** But during the past several years, another type of digital camera has been slowly rising in popularity: the single-lens reflex (SLR) camera, from manufacturers including Nikon, Canon, Sony and Olympus. Although bulkier, these cameras produce pictures that more accurately represent what's in their viewfinders than those that use older technology.

Newspapers/Magazines In 2008, newspaper advertising revenues declined by 17.7%, according to the Newspaper Assoc. of America. Meanwhile, average daily circulation at 379 newspapers fell 10.6% from April **Next Col**

through September 2009, compared to the same period a year ago, according to the Audit Bureau of Circulations. Magazines haven't fared any better. In 2009, more than 360 magazines shut down. During the first half of 2009, ad pages fell 27.9% when compared to the same period in 2008, according to Publishers Information Bureau. The morning newspaper has been replaced by a growing online media presence — much of which is accessible for free. The Amazon Kindle — even with its price tag of around \$250 — and other eBook readers could increasingly become one-stop sources to access newspapers, magazines and books. **CD's** The past decade was one of the worst for the industry. In the beginning, there was Napster. Then came iTunes, which was introduced in 2001 and offered affordable pricing and easy accessibility. Face it, CDs aren't coming back. Record stores are feeling the pinch. Most Virgin Mega-stores in the U.S. have shut down following declines in sales and revenues. In 2004, Tower Records entered bankruptcy and by 2006 most locations had closed. **Gas-guzzling Cars** Recent announcements by car manufacturers to mass produce fuel-efficient cars could help push consumers away from gas-guzzling vehicles.

In 2010, consumer should expect to see more revolutionary products supplanting old mainstays. In media, DVDs, books, newspapers and magazines will continue to lose ground to services like in-home movie rentals and gadgets like the Amazon Kindle. In big-ticket items, the push for energy efficiency will continue to influence consumer decisions on cars and home upgrades.

But two days before the wedding, she says Gibbs left her a goodbye note saying he couldn't go through with the wedding He also wrote her a \$5,000 dollar check. She says she tore up both and instead sued him for breach of contract.

"He callously allowed her to quit her job, move back and into his house where she had no income and then after a couple of months he just put her out on the streets and said 'you know you're on your own'," said District Attorney Lydia Sartain.
